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


## History of ORS

Originally, ORS represented the "public interest of South Carolina," which was statutorily defined as a balancing of:

- 1. concerns of the using and consuming public with respect to public utility services, regardless of the class of customer;
- 2. economic development and job attraction and retention in South Carolina; and
- 3. preservation of the financial integrity of the state's public utilities and continued investment in and maintenance of utility facilities so as to provide reliable and high quality utility services.

In 2018, the definition of "public interest" became "the concerns of the using and consuming public with respect to public utility services, regardless of the class of customer and preservation of continued investment in and maintenance of utility facilities so as to provide reliable and high quality utility services."



## ORS's Traditional Responsibilities

- To investigate and make recommendations to the Commission regarding the regulated operations of public utilities. "Public utilities" primarily include investor owned:
  - Water and wastewater utilities (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-5-10)
  - Natural gas utilities (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-5-10)
  - Telephone utilities (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-9-10)
  - Railroads and Railways (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-17-10)
  - Motor Vehicle Carriers (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-23-10)
  - Electric Utilities (S.C. Code Ann. § 58-27-10)
- ORS does not regulate municipal utility systems.
- In 2019, Act No. 56 gave ORS limited authority to examine electric cooperatives.
- In 2021, Act No. 90 gave ORS additional responsibilities related to Santee Cooper.



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## Additional Departments

#### State Energy Office

Serves as the principal energy planning entity for the state.


#### South Carolina Broadband Office

Central broadband planning body to coordinate with federal, state, regional, local, and private entities.

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#### South Carolina Equipment Distribution Program

Serves South Carolina residents who have trouble hearing or speaking on the phone.



## Additional Departments

#### Pipeline Safety

Safety oversight for natural gas distribution and transmission pipelines.


#### Railroad Safety

Works in partnership with the Federal Railroad Administration.

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#### Emergency Management

Works in coordination with the SC Emergency Management Division during disasters.
