

Why Should We Care? Ethics and Public Safety


- Every person charged with a crime has a constitutional right to "effective assistance of counsel" under the Sixth Amendment. See Gideon.
- An attorney has an ethical obligation to provide "effective assistance of counsel."
- A judge has an ethical obligation to ensure that each defendant is provided "effective assistance of counsel"
- Prosecution of criminal acts requires that counsel be appointed for those who can't afford it.


Gideon v. Wainwright --Right to Counsel

MSPD Caseload Analysis – "The Missouri Project"

- 2014: Study by the ABA and Rubin-Brown (an accounting firm)
- Rubin-Brown applies Delphi workload measurement methods to quantify "appropriate caseloads" by hours spent.
- This is now a national standard of measuring attorney workload.

Caseload Compared 2019-2020

2019

- 18 attorneys and 2 managing attorneys
- ▶ Total pending cases: 2,018
- Ave. caseload per attorney: 112

2020

- 21 attorneys and 2 managing attorneys
- Total pending cases: 2,638
- Ave. caseload per attorney:120

Ave. percentage IN EXCESS of Rubin-Brown recommended caseload **per attorney in 2020**:

147% over recommended caseload

Ethics – in re Karl Hinkbein

- In September, 2017, Karl Hinkbein was disciplined and placed on probation by the Missouri Supreme Court for violating ethics rules.
- The court found that he failed to diligently represent and keep his clients informed of the status of their post-conviction relief proceedings.
- He had chronic health problems requiring several hospitalizations.
- He believed that he could not refuse his case assignments.
- His post-conviction relief/appellate caseload was 110 cases.









Section 600.064 – Private Counsel Appointment

- Passed in 2013.
- A circuit court judge can appoint private counsel.
- Court must ensure that defendant is "indigent."
- Provide appointed counsel with a hearing if requested.
- Litigation expenses paid by MSPD.
- No attorney compensation provision.


Local Court Rule 21.6

- Passed by Court en banc in May, 2019.
- Cases where defendant on bond and likelihood of future confinement is very low.
- Certain attorney categories excluded (21.6(5).
- Meant to include all attorneys in St. Louis County who are in good standing and active status.
- Substitution with court approval permitted.
- Petition for hardship within 10 days.
- Appointments, excuses and substitutions made by Presiding Judge only.
- No compensation.
- No provisions for malpractice insurance.

Jan. 1, 2020: MSPD Waitlist Authorized

- Defendants have new charges only (no old cases).
- They are on bond.
- They have low-level felony charges without other complications [language, immigration, mental illness, injured victims]
- They have probation plea offers.
- They have a low risk of any kind of incarceration sanction.
- There were about 150 defendants on the list.

March, 2020 Attorney Appointments Were Set To Begin




How Will This Work?

- Randomized current database from MO Bar.
- Select some cases from the waitlist (pre-screened)
- Appoint the attorney
- Notice is sent electronically.
- Notice is mailed to appointed attorney with
 - Instructions ("protocol") and
 - Client case information sheet from PD intake.
- Video training is available for viewing.
- Form motions (discovery, suppression) available for download.
- Client meeting rooms available in courthouse.

Other Helpful Facts

- Work through attorney list before coming back to you.
- You can arrange for a substitute, which must be approved by the Presiding Judge.
- Litigation expenses paid if approved in advance.
- If the client is charged with more cases and the recommendation changes to include confinement, MSPD will take the case back.
- Video training resources (CLE credit pending)
- Downloadable motions.
- MSPD will take your questions.
