Harris/Walz Administration Priorities

The Economy

- Expand upon the Chips and Science Act and the Inflation Reduction Act
- Affordable housing expansion, incentives for first time homebuyers

Taxation

- Raise the corporate income tax rate from 21% to 28%
- Expand the child tax credits
- More moderate antitrust priorities
- Eliminate taxes on tips

Trade

- A Harris Administration would likely retain the tariffs implemented by President Biden
- Supports reforms to the WTO dispute-settlement mechanism
- Continued focus on reshoring critical supply chains

International Affairs

- Support for strengthened Indo-Pacific relations
- De-risk US relations with China
- Continue the restriction of high tech products that can be exported to China
- Support for greater security coordination among Indo-Pacific nations



Trump/Vance Administration Priorities

The Economy

- Tariffs on Chinese imports and on countries with which the U.S. has a trade deficit
- Growing U.S. manufacturing jobs

Taxation

- 2026 Renewal of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act
- Eliminate taxes on tips
- Child tax credit

Trade

- 2026 United States Mexico Canada Agreement review (Trump criticisms of Chinese investment in Mexico)
- 10% tariff rates and 60% tariff rates on Chinese Goods
- Trump Reciprocal Trade Act
- Removal from Indo-Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity
- Bilateralism, not multilateralism

International Affairs

- Significant economic decoupling from China and onshoring of critical manufacturing
- Questions the role of NATO, UN, Multilateralism
- Unlikely to continue providing military and financial aide for Ukraine at current levels



Harris and Trump Insights – Health Care



Harris: Health Care

- Vice President Harris largely frames health care agenda through lens of lowering costs
 - Expanding Inflation Reduction Act prescription drug savings, including negotiating more drugs under Medicare and expanding \$35 cap on insulin out-of-pocket costs to commercial market
 - Protecting and expanding ACA, including support for enhanced tax credits, Medicaid expansion, and simplified CHIP enrollment
 - Continued FTC focus on health care mergers; pharmacy benefit managers; drug patent listings
 - Expanding medical debt relief efforts
- Reproductive rights, maternal health care, access to in vitro fertilization (IVF) major focuses for Democrats



Trump: Health Care – "Concepts of a Plan"

- GOP Platform outlines a commitment to reducing healthcare costs:
 - Increased transparency
 - Promoting choice and competition
 - Expanded access to new affordable healthcare and prescription drug options
 - Benefit flexibility
- Improve care for older Americans through:
 - Chronic disease prevention and management
 - Increased long-term care options
 - Investments in at-home senior care
 - Expanded access to primary care
 - Tax credits to support unpaid family caregivers
- Address healthcare worker shortages
- First Trump Administration attempted to effectively prohibit Medicare drug rebates by removing the safe harbor protection that shields rebates from federal anti-kickback laws
- Most Favored Nations drug pricing policy
- Blueprint to Lower Drug Prices and Reduce Out-of-Pocket Costs
 - Incentives for lower list prices for drugs
 - Medicare drug price negotiation
 - Improved competition



Harris and Trump Insights – International Trade



Trump: International Trade

- Goal is to be "tougher" than the Democrats, aggressive approach to China and countries with whom U.S. has a trade deficit
- Aggressive use of Presidential authority to restrict or tax imports from various countries, including most notably China, Mexico, and others (i.e. EU Members) with large trade surpluses with the U.S.
- Aggressive use of tariffs. Proposal for 10% across the board tariffs, 50 to 60% import tariff
 on Chinese imports
- Renegotiation of USMCA
- Other "creative" proposals. Currency devaluation?



Harris: International Trade

 Insight 1: Focus China tariffs on select sectors like EV, semiconductors, steel and solar and keep tariffs.

• Insight 2: Unclear what will do on 2026 USMCA review after voting against USMCA.

Insight 3: Oppose attempts by foreign countries or entities to purchase key
 U.S. industries – and protect labor – in deals such as the U.S.
 Steel-Nippon merger.



Harris and Trump Insights – Energy and Climate



Harris: Energy and Climate

- The Big Question: What happens to the Inflation Reduction Act?
 - Tax Credits
 - Grants, Loans, and Loan Guarantees
- Permitting With different priorities, can the parties cut a deal?
- Environmental Regulation Two Different Approaches
- Areas of Shared Interest Nuclear Energy, Hydrogen, Geothermal
- Other Priorities
 - Environmental Justice
 - Engagement with Labor



Trump: Energy and Climate

- Roll back SEC rules on climate disclosure
- Rescind many of Pres. Biden's clean energy rules, e.g. power plants and emissions from vehicles
- Permitting approval. Speed approval of power plants, other energy projects, expand permits for fossil fuels, pipeline approval, restart LNG exports
- Reduce and roll back EV incentives
- Cut the budget at the EPA, NOAA
- "Modernize" Nuclear Regulatory Commission to speed approvals and extend life of existing facilities
- Inflation Reduction Act. Would Trump repeal it?



Fall U.S. Congressional Priorities

- FY2025 Appropriations bills
- Farm Bill Reauthorization
- Pandemic and All-Hazards Preparedness Reauthorization Act
- FY2025 National Defense Authorization (NDAA) Act
- 2024 District, State, and National Elections
 - Three weeks of Congressional session before the election
 - Senate and House adjourn on September 27
- House-led "China Week" in September
 - Potential bills that will be voted on are Protecting American Agriculture from Foreign Adversaries Act, No WHO Pandemic Preparedness Treaty Without Senate Approval Act, DHS Restrictions on Confucius Institutes and Chinese Entities of Concern Act, and the Protect America's Innovation and Economic Security from CCP Act
 - The BIOSECURE Act passed the House (306-81) on September 9th

Congress Enters the Matrix

- NO FAKES Act
- NO Al Fraud Act
- Protecting Consumers from Deceptive Al Act
- Generative AI Copyright Disclosure Act
- Preventing Abuse of Digital Replicas Act





NO FAKES Act

- The Nurture Originals, Foster Art, and Keep Entertainment Safe Act (the "NO FAKES Act").
- Draft legislation intended to address the use of non-consensual digital replications in audiovisual works or sound recordings.
 - Hearing to examine the NO FAKES Act most recently held on April 30, 2024.
- Increases liability for unauthorized digital reproductions of an individual's image, voice, and visual likeness in audiovisual work or sound recordings.
- If enacted, the Act is intended to:
 - Hold individuals or companies liable if they produce an unauthorized digital replica of an individual in a performance.
 - Hold platforms liable for hosting an unauthorized digital replica if the platform has knowledge of the fact that the replica was not authorized by the individual depicted.
 - Exclude certain digital replicas from coverage based on recognized First Amendment protections.



NO AI Fraud Act

- On January 10, 2024, lawmakers in the House of Representatives announced the introduction of a new bill called the No Artificial Intelligence Fake Replicas And Unauthorized Duplications Act of 2024 (the "No AI FRAUD Act").
 - The Act aims to "establish a federal framework to protect Americans' individual right to their likeness and voice against AI-generated fakes and forgeries..."
- Intends to safeguard the property rights associated with an individual's likeness and voice by targeting the unauthorized use of technological tools, defined as "personalized cloning services."
- Extends the protections offered under the NO FAKES Act.
- Incorporates immensely broad terms.



Protecting Consumers from Deceptive Al Act

- Congresswoman Anna G. Eshoo (CA) and Congressman Neal Dunn (FL), bipartisan members of the Taskforce on Artificial Intelligence, introduced the Protecting Consumers from Deceptive AI Act on March 21, 2024.
- Intends to direct the development of standards to identify and label AI-generated content and requires generative AI developers and online content platforms to provide disclosures on AI-generated content.



Generative AI Copyright Disclosure Act

- Introduced by Representative Adam Schiff (D-Cal.) on April 9, 2024.
- Intends to foster transparency between creators and companies.
- If enacted, the Act will:
 - Require notice to the Register of Copyrights identifying all copyrighted works used in building or altering the training dataset for a generative Al system.
 - Retroactive effect.
 - Notice to be submitted **no later than 30-days before** the generative AI system is available to consumers.
 - Require the Copyright Register to establish and maintain a publicly available online database that contains each notice.



Preventing Abuse of Digital Replicas Act

- On August 9, 2024 Congressman Darrell Issa (CA-48) introduced a discussion draft of the Preventing Abuse of Digital Replicas Act ("PADRA").
- Intends to **protect** the **voice**, **image**, **and likeness** of individuals from being used in unauthorized commercial ways.
- If enacted, PADRA will:
- PADRA will:
 - Target the commercial misuse of digital replicas of individuals' identifying characteristics, such as their likeness or voice.
 - Protect the public from the deceptive use of digital replicas to confuse consumers about an individual's endorsement or affiliation with a product, service, or other commercial activity.
 - Adapt and strengthen existing trademark law under the Lanham Act, limiting uncertainty about scope, process, and court interpretation.
 - Establish a legal framework for victims to seek redress.
 - Include provisions to ensure that the protections do not infringe upon free expression rights.
