





NORTH CAROLINA PRO BONO RESOURCE CENTER

- The NC Supreme Court recognizes attorneys who voluntarily report at least 50 hours through the Pro Bono Honor Society.
- Attorneys can report their hours at <u>www.ncprobono.org/report</u>

"Every lawyer has a professional responsibility to provide legal services to those unable to pay. A lawyer should aspire to render at least (50) hours of pro bono public legal services per year" NC Rule of Professional Responsibility 6.1

EMERITUS / OUT-OF-STATE STATUS

Retired attorneys and attorneys with active bar licenses in other states may practice pro bono in North Carolina under the supervision of a NC licensed attorney working at a Legal Services Organization.
